

Our Vision: To give America's most vulnerable children hope and a life-changing experience thus improving their lives, our communities, economy, and culture.



Music is transforming children's lives placing them on a course toward success.

Program Highlights

Our partnership with the School District of Lancaster, Youth Intervention Center, and Red Lion School District allowed us to teach 579 music lessons to 211 students. Our teachers collaborated and brought students together from various schools to perform pieces as one choir and band during spring and fall performances.

Our second 5-week camp was held during the summer with 30 students receiving 80 hours of music instruction, 60 hours of enrichment classes, meals, mentoring, and 3 performances.




"It's an honor to be part of this organization.

If you are reading this note then you have likely been one of our students' silent heroes! Your support of SWAN has touched vulnerable children's lives giving them life-changing and empowering skills. We value your contributions and extend to you our deepest gratitude.

As a SWAN partner, you have made it possible for us to serve more than 200 children in 2019. We were able to run a full-day summer music camp for 5 weeks and in the fall begin a SWAN branch in the Red Lion Area School District.

Since SWAN began in 2011, we have accomplished our yearly goals with minimal staff, focusing on the establishment of the program. We responsibly used 80% of our 2019 donated dollars towards our program costs. Our team of teachers, a branch director, administrative assistant, and volunteers have all worked part-time hours. As the executive director, I have volunteered my full-time hours since founding SWAN and began receiving some part-time remuneration in 2017. It took the dedication and care of every one of our team members to create our excellent program for some of Lancaster city's most traumatized children. The children's progress and the reports we receive from parents and guardians keep us in the work and compel us to reach more children.

We have much to celebrate as we review 2019. We are grateful for our students and their progress and every supporter, staff member, and volunteer!

This will place us in a better position to enroll more children, serve more schools, and become the model for other community benefitting groups.

To fulfill these plans we will need the continued generous support of our SWAN community members and to increase SWAN awareness so that others can join our mission.
