

Program Highlights

Our partnership with the School District of Lancaster, Youth Intervention Center, and Red Lion School District allowed us to teach 1,630 music lessons to 232 students. During the spring and most of the summer, our program consisted of **virtual** private lessons (due to pandemic restrictions), with some students receiving instruction twice a week. We began teaching group and private in-person classes in the fall while continuing virtual lessons with some students. On five different occasions, students performed for the community showcasing their progress. Our teachers noted that their students were focused, learned quickly, supported each other, and were diligent in practice. Students who received lessons twice a week especially excelled.







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Summer Celebration
