Program Highlights

Our partnership with the School District of Lancaster, Red Lion School District, and four private music studios allowed us to teach 1,266 music lessons to 94 students. Of the 94 students, 35 were given additional private lessons during the spring and fall. In the summer, 30 students participated in our 4-day, 5-week music camp, in which 8 students received daily private lessons in addition to 6 daily group lessons. On 22 different occasions, students performed for the community showcasing their progress. Our teachers noted that their students were focused, learned quickly, supported each other, and were diligent in practice. Students who received lessons twice a week especially excelled. Our partnership at the Youth Intervention Center allowed us to hold 60 classes with 10–12 children participating each week.

As we begin 2023, SWAN's vision, mission, and core values inspire us to dream big and press on confidently, determined to make a difference in our students' lives.

To make SWAN the most excellent program of its kind and more fully meet our students' needs, we are collaborating with mental health agencies to add trauma management and music therapy classes to our program. Our hours of operation will also be expanded beyond the after-school hours, transforming SWAN into the first Music School of its kind in our nation.

Our SWAN Music School will offer the following:

- Music Lessons, Ensemble Lessons, Performance Opportunities
- Spiritual Development
- Caring Mentors
- Transportation
- Mental Health Care: Music Therapy and Trauma Management

We will have a research team study this new model. Then, as the study's results underscore its effectiveness, we will publish them and hope to scale our program.

Our Wish List includes having the funds to run a full-day summer music camp, increase our hours of operation, and transport students to classes and performances.
