Program Highlights

Our partnership with the School District of Lancaster, Red Lion School District, and nine private music studios allowed us to teach 2,163 music lessons to 116 students. Of the 116 students, 48 were given additional private lessons during the spring and fall. In the summer, 27 students participated in our 4-day, 6-week music camp, in which students received daily private lessons, 7 daily group lessons, and access to mental health counselors. Students at camp participated in a mental health social-emotional learning class in which 70% increased their personal assessment scores. On 25 different occasions, students performed for the community, showcasing their progress. Our partnership at the Youth Intervention Center allowed us to hold 73 classes with 10-12 children participating each week.







Combining music-making's power, joy, and beauty with immediate access to mental health counseling and trauma management classes, our Rising Stars Summer Music Camp was an immediate success. We created a safe, loving place where our students could powerfully express their emotions without a word, stimulate their minds by learning, and enjoy the physical benefits of playing instruments, singing, and dancing. While the music helped them relax and regulate their emotions, they also received trauma management classes and had immediate access to mental health counselors that they knew and trusted. We were so proud when they shared their beautiful programs with the community by performing at multiple venues.

SWAN is excited to continue this power-packed program for School District of Lancaster students throughout the 2024 - 25 school year.
